## WHAT'S UP FOR NEXT SEASON

Colonial Players' 66th season is an enticing blend of comedy, drama, and music that will take you from 17th century Paris through World War II and into contemporary America. The season that begins in September includes two musicals: our own Richard Wade-Dick Gessner version of *A Christmas Carol* and *Ernest in Love*, a witty satire based on Oscar Wilde's classic theater piece, *The Importance of Being Earnest*. The season begins and ends with two contemporary pieces. *Rocket Man*, opening in September, is a serious comedy about a man coping with a mid-life crisis who looks to the stars for a second chance at happiness. The season ends with the outrageous and absurdist comedy *Why Torture is Wrong and the People Who Love Them*, Christopher Durang's adult look at America's efforts to maintain homeland security during a time of worldwide terrorism. Lillian Hellman's *Watch on the Rhine* is a classic American drama set during Hitler's rise to power, and Aaron Sorkin's *A Few Good Men* is a taut courtroom drama about honor and discipline in the Marine Corps. We will begin 2015 with *The Liar*, David Ives' sparkling, fast-paced comedy of mistaken motives and identities based on a play written in 1643.
