Do you know what the Colonial Players were up to during their 64th Season?

- ★ Over 300 volunteers donated their time and talents to produce our 64th Season! Over 25 people volunteered for each production—and a whopping 65 people assisted with 1776 alone! And we can't forget about our ushers, box office volunteers, and many team members that keep our theater running smoothly every single day!
- ★ Over **17,200** tickets were sold during our 64th Season—over **80**%!
- ★ Colonial Players maintains a loyal subscriber base of over **1,300** people!
- ★ To determine our 64th season lineup, our Play Selection Committee considered over 130 plays, reading about 75 of them prior to narrowing it down to the 7 that we presented!
- ★ Colonial Players received a total of 15 WATCH nominations in 2013 across four of our 64th season productions: Cinderella Waltz, Chapter Two, Going to St. Ives, and Moonlight & Magnolias!
- ★ Going to St. Ives won three 2013 WATCH awards: Outstanding Direction of a Play, Outstanding Lead Actress in a Play, and Outstanding Play!
- ★ Shipwrecked! The Amazing Adventures of Louis de Rougement (as told by himself) was the recipient of the 2013 Ruby Griffith Award for Outstanding Achievement in a Play!
- ★ John Fiorillo's play Dancing Backwards was chosen from over 200 submissions during the 2012 Promising Playwright Contest. Mr. Fiorillo joined Colonial Players in July for a weekend workshop of his play, and he let us know that "the experience at Colonial will remain in [his] heart and mind forever."
- Colonial Players was able to assist Anne Arundel County with their annual Angel Tree Program during A Christmas Carol.

- Patrons provided gifts for 100 underprivileged children in Anne Arundel County. The cast of *A Christmas Carol* also collected a total of \$854 in monetary donations for the program.
- With the proceeds from A Christmas Carol, Colonial Players was able to donate funds or equipment to four worthy organizations: the Annapolis Film Festival, Dignity Players, Tasty Monster Productions, and Unity Gardens.
- ★ Our 2013 scholarship recipient was Hannah Sturm! Hannah attends St. Mary's College of Maryland, where she is majoring in Theater Studies. She began volunteering with Colonial Players through an internship in May 2012, and is still always willing to lend us a helping hand when she's home from school on a break!
- Our Production Team spent countless hours revising and updating the Production Manual. The manual was approved by our Board in June 2013 and is available for download on our website!
- ★ Six members participated in a 4-week Acting Workshop taught by Ken Skrzesz.
- ★ A new partnership with eCruisers, LLC allows for free shuttle service to and from our theatre in the downtown Annapolis area.
- ★ Colonial Players began recycling this season to reduce our waste.
- A new integrated phone system was installed at our theatre to better serve our patrons, volunteers, and members.
- ★ A new sign was installed on our theater building in December 2012 to draw attention to our building from both ends of East Street. Flower pots were also added to beautify our sidewalk.
